


Brzdac A classic cake with two layers of sponge cake filled and topped with chocolate cream, usually decorated with Fork-made wave patterns.

The Malta Lake Traveler

One of the most famous canoeing and rowing tracks in the world. Around the lake you can find activities such as hiking and cycling paths, mini-golf and a ski slope.

The complex features 18 sports and recreational swimming pools, thermal water pools and an aqua park with numerous attractions.



Poznan's New Zoo zoo.poznan.pl

A vast zoological garden (over 120 ha). Nearly 3,5 thousand animals live here in conditions that resemble their natural habitats as closely as possible.















Old Market Square mnp.art.pl

The Renaissance gem from the 16th century. Every day at noon two mechanical goats appear on the tower, butting heads 12 times.

Wolności Square poznan.pl

The Freedom Square's most recognizable landmark is Fontanna Wolności (the Fountain of freedom)

Kolegiacki Square poznan.pl

Along the southern edge of the square stands the building of the former Jesuit college. Today it serves as the seat of the municipal authorities.

Imperial Castle ckzamek.pl

The last and youngest monarchical residence in Europe. Built in 1910 for German Emperor Wilhelm II, the castle now serves as a cultural centre.

Poznań International Fair mtp.pl

The largest industrial fair in Poland, featuring the country's biggest exhibition and conference infrastructure. e.g. the Earth Hall can accommodate nearly 2,000 people.

The Municipal Stadium eneastadion.pl

Enea Stadium, home to Lech Poznań football team, offers guided tours. It also serves as a venue for concerts and conferences.

UAM Collegium Minus – Adam Mickiewicz University amu.edu.pl

Due to its rich history, the university is traditionally ranked among Poland's most reputable institutions of higher education, a status consistently reflected in national rankings.
